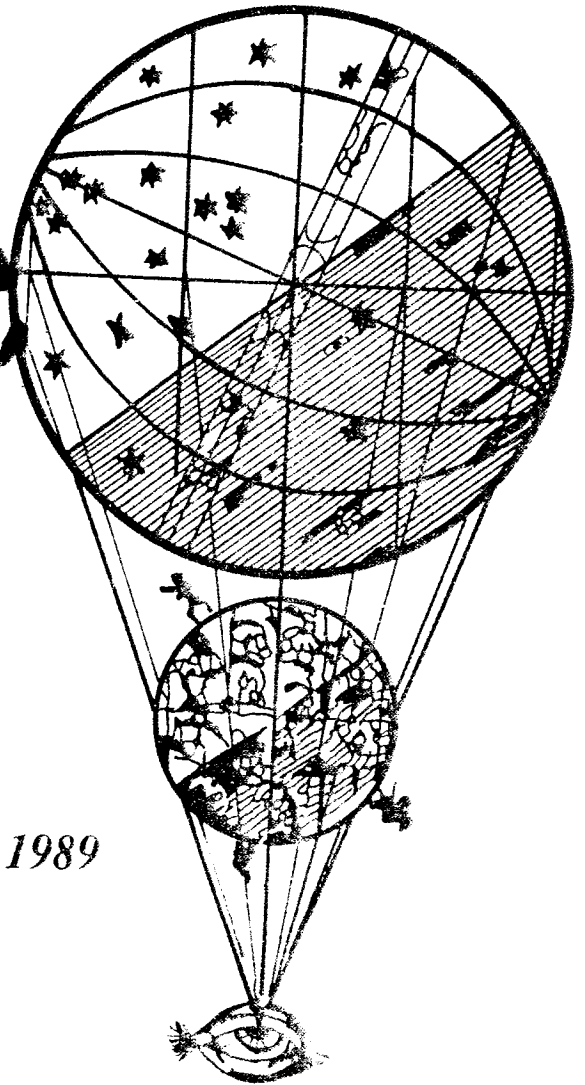

THE FEDERAL UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY, AKURE

BRIEF HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The Federal University of Technology, Akure, which came into legal existence in September, 1981, is one of the five autonomous full-fledged Federal Universities of Technology that now exist in the country. Its first Vice Chancellor, Professor Theodore Idibiye Francis, was formally appointed on November 19, 1981 but did not assume duties until January 1, 1982. He worked single-handedly to lay the foundation of the University, under the guidance of a 13-man Governing Council, headed by the first Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council, the late High Chief (Dr) Gabriel Akin-Deko, until August 1982 when other principal officers joined him. Later, a crop of experienced and highly-motivated academic and other staff was recruited to facilitate the commencement of academic activities. These activities took off in November 1982, when 149 students were enrolled in the three foundation Schools. From the 1989/90 Session the configuration of these Schools changed and another School was added

The four Schools are:-

- (i) School of Agriculture and Agricultural Technology.
- (ii) School of Sciences.
- (iii) School of Engineering and Engineering Technology.
- (iv) School of Environmental Technology.

The students' total enrolment has also risen to 1,306 in the 1988/89 year, while the staff strength (academic and non-academic) stands at 578.

In its first few years, that is, from 1982 to August 1985, the University had to share the physical facilities at the 'emergency' campus of the Federal Polytechnic, Akure with the Polytechnic. In fact, from 1982 to 1983, the Polytechnic could only release five blocks of classrooms to the University for its academic activities and merely conceded an additional block of 4 classrooms and a warehouse after protracted negotiations sometimes towards the later part of 1983. More physical facilities were not released to the University until August 1985. In the interval between 1982 and August 1985 when the University co-existed with the Polytechnic on the 'emergency' campus, the University augmented the physical facilities available to it by constructing a storey building which has since served as the Physics Laboratory and provided additional staff offices. In addition, some duplex bungalows, which were handed over to the University by the Federal Polytechnic at different stages of completion, were completed and put to use as administrative blocks, students' hostels and accommodation for other supporting services.

The Polytechnic finally completed its movement to Ado-Ekiti in February, 1986 when the University took full possession of the entire campus, with an area of 640 hectares. A series of renovation and re-construction work has since been completed or embarked upon to ensure maximum functional utility of the existing physical infrastructure. Renovation and redesigning projects already completed comprise, among others, 31 laboratories, 2 engineering workshops, 3 studios, a Senate Council Chamber/Vice-Chancellor's office complex, an administration complex and a library complex. In addition, the University has provided improved hostel facilities, a farm house, car parks, street lights and better roads, together with extensive landscaping and walk-ways. Also, the University has completed and put to use a total of 13 duplex bungalows situated at the 'emergency' campus and 34 different types of housing units located at the Obanla camp, all of which were inherited from the Federal Polytechnic at various stages of construction. At present work has been completed on a large auditorium (the venue of this convocation), two lecture theatres and the installation of a P.A.B.X. system. Work has commenced on the construction of some school blocks, sports complex and a network of roads.

In addition to the mini campus, the University has an extensive land area measuring 6,567 hectares on the Akure–Owo road as part of its landed property. The University is making steady efforts to develop, in stages, this site, as and when resources are available.

Since its inception, a few notable events have stood out in the life of the University. These include the turning of the sod by the then President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Alhaji Shehu Shagari on April 28, 1982 and the formal opening of the University on Saturday, April 16, 1983 by the then Vice-President of the country, Dr. Alex Ekwueme. On 14th November, 1988, Prof. A.A. Ilemobade assumed office as the second Vice-Chancellor of the University.

The University has, in its short life span, organised and hosted annual foundation day lectures given by such eminent scholars as Prof. O. O. Akinkugbe, 1983, Prof. O.S. Adegoke, (1987) National Merit Award Winner, 1984; Prof. C. I. O. Olaniyan, 1985; Prof. B.N. Okigbo, 1986; Prof. E.A. Fayose, 1987, Prof. J. Ekundayo, 1988 and Prof. S. A. Balogun, 1989. Six inaugural Lectures have been given by prominent professors of the University in the persons of Prof. L. K. Opeke on April 17, 1984, Prof. A. A. Ilemobade, June 25, 1985, Prof. T. A. Afolayan, January 27, 1987, Prof. O. A. Fámoriyo, 23rd June, 1987, Prof. L. B. Kolawole, on 29th March, 1988, and Prof. O. T. Adepoju on 21st March, 1989.

As a means of making itself relevant to the immediate community and Nigeria at large, the University has established an extra-mural programme, a science laboratory technology training scheme, an apprenticeship programme for the benefit of its staff and the immediate community. It also has a Consultancy Unit to provide expert professional services to industries and other bodies and individuals that might require its services. The University Staff School which was opened on November 14, 1983 serves both the University community and the general public. It is today reputed to be one of the best of such schools in the entire Ondo State, judging by the outstanding performance of its graduating pupils in national competitive examinations.

It is note-worthy that the University is so far the only one running a first degree programme in Mining Engineering in the whole country. Also, our Department of Meteorology is the only one of its kind in West Africa and it is complemented in the whole of black Africa by only a second one located in Nairobi, Kenya.
